

Our monthly meeting was held August 2 at the downtown Optimist Club.

Club Emblem: The updated emblem has been approved and sent to the digitizer. The first dozen hats have been ordered. Additionally, it was asked if the emblem could be applied to knit shirts. I rechecked this and the answer is yes. It cannot be done as part of a hat order but has to have a regular minimum order of this type of shirt. I do not have a price quote for knit shirts as of yet.

Shirts: We discussed the possibility of having t-shirts made. The price of having the screens cut for the design is \$96.00. This is a one time charge. Ordering "dark" shirts with a 25 minimum order makes the unit cost \$8.15 per shirt. This price is for the Small to XL sizes. Each X increase carries an additional cost of \$1.50. For Example, an XXXL would cost \$8.15 plus \$3.00 for a total of \$11.15 per shirt. We can each order as many as we want and in the individual colors we want.

Sticker: Joe Pendergrass offered to use scrap from his graphics business and create bumper stickers for us at no charge. How can you beat that. The Vector file for this venture is not yet available.

Fish Contest: As we got started a little late, there are not many entries. Check either our website, WWW.columbiaareaarchers.com or our bulletin board at the powderhorn gunshop for rules and info.

Big Game Contest: This may suprise us as the season unfolds. We already have 4 bear and an Alligator entered. Remember, even "Does" count but we need a picture of each animal taken to get in the Drawing.

Range: Currently the regional range project is in the Commissions hands. Sometime this month it will get aired at the regional Commission team meeting. If it is again approved, it becomes a "Project". Design and cost figures will have to be compiled to get this into next years budget. We are going to try and meet the needs of as many organized archery groups as possible. This will necessitate several different types of ranges. This project will not happen overnight. We believe it may take up to 2 years.
